



Drive Thru Trunk or Treat FAQ

Thank you for volunteering to host and decorate a trunk in this year's Trunk or Treat event!

Please remember:

- **Trunk hosts must enter from Little Nolan Road.** Every parking space is numbered so please park **only** in your assigned space, and clean up any trash before you leave.
- All participants must wear masks and socially distance (6 ft.) from other trunks and volunteers.
 - You don't have to wear your mask if you are at your trunk and socially distanced.
- All candy is pre-bagged and will be passed out from a table as vehicles exit the parking lot, so you do not need to bring any candy yourself.
- Wave to all passing vehicles - we want to show as much excitement and spirit as possible!

Event Timeline

- **2:45 - 3:00 p.m. - Set-up Begins!**
 - Elaborate trunks are great, but you must allow for extra set-up time.
 - Please do not be late! Families start lining up **very early** for the event.
- **3:45 p.m. - 15 Minutes Until Start**
- **4:00 p.m. - Event Begins!**
 - Vehicles filled with costumed kids will slowly drive past each trunk.
 - Wave, hold up signs, say hi and they go past.
- **6:00 p.m. - Event ends**
 - Begin breaking down your trunk and placing any trash into a provided trashbag
- **6:15 p.m. - Volunteers begin collecting trash bags**
- **6:30 p.m. Wrap up & head home**

How should I decorate my vehicle?

There are many fun ways you can decorate your trunk and make it fun for the Trunk or Treaters! Our Trunk or Treaters range from toddlers to older children, so please keep it family-friendly and **DO NOT USE** any scary items like horror images, gore, etc. The best way to start is to pick a theme.

Example Trunk Ideas:

- Blast from the past ('50's, '60's, etc.)
- Children's books (Ex: Harry Potter, Dr. Seuss)
- Pirates, Circus, Farm
- Cartoon characters (Ex: Minions, Superhero's)
- Camping, Under the sea, Hawaiian luau
- Popular movies (Ex: Frozen, Star Wars, Coco)
- Spiderweb car, Mummy car
- Sports, Video games, I Spy book

Event Details:

There will be 2 tables, one at the entrance of the trunks, and one at the end. At the beginning, there will be volunteers to answer questions from the incoming drivers. All volunteers are required to wear a mask and remain 6 feet from car windows.

The table at the end is where the candy will be passed out. Volunteers at this table will be wearing masks and gloves, and passing out candy with minimal to no contact. Hand sanitizer will be at both stations, and a first aid station will be available at the end table.

Vehicles will enter from Elms Road and exit onto Little Nolan Road.
